Welcome Center

Directly across from Lake Junaluska is the 18-hole Junaluska Golf Course, which spans 5,034 yards and has a par of 68.

Aquatic Center

The Lake Junaluska Aquatic Center is open daily from 10:00 a.m.–8:00 p.m. Cost: Pool: \$10/person, \$30/family of 4 (free for guests booked through Lake Junaluska; wristbands given at check-in).

Recreation Hut

Lake Junaluska features a scenic 2.3-mile walking trail that winds around the lake and conference center grounds. It

features the Rose Walk, fishing areas and several resting points where visitors may stop for meditation and relaxation.

Junaluska Gifts and Grounds

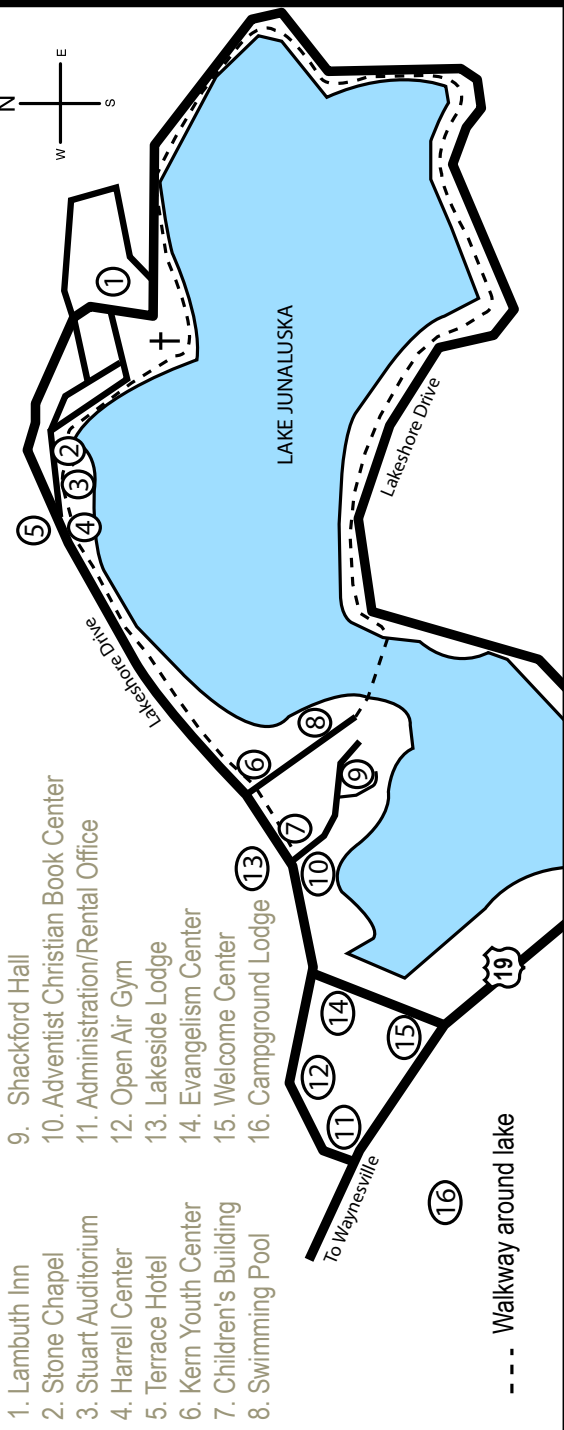
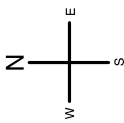
